Colleen has also been Event Director for the Melbourne International Blues Festival and Australian Music Week, and she has worked extensively in Publishing where she sourced, developed and nurtured new talent, negotiated and wrote contracts and created data bases of clients and talent.

In 2006, Colleen starting her own company, Asia Sounds Pty Ltd, developing Asian music artists for the international market. She presented showcase events and even a TV show that aired across most of Asia including China, Japan, South Korea, India, Sri Lanka, Philippines, Brunei and Thailand.

Currently, Colleen is managing Australian indigenous Artists 'The Merindas' and she regularly works with indigenous artists and songwriters, assisting them with career development.
